- An inclusive, Early Childhood Education Center that provides reliable, high-quality childcare year-round, accessible to working families.
 - Progressive and innovative early childhood education programs that nurture the whole child and foster diverse worldviews.
 - An empowered network of teachers, staff, and parents that supports family development and community connections.

Then, once a year, we evaluate our effectiveness in meeting these goals. We put it all down on paper and see if we've done what we've set out to do... and then we share the results with you in this Annual Report.

I share all of this with you, our families- the sole reason this organization exists - to show that behind all the fun and games and smiling faces, Kaleidoscope has very real goals to achieve and that we, as a board, hold ourselves accountable to achieving these goals at every step.

But it's also important that YOU know these goals. I invite you to reflect on them, to ensure they resonate with your family's vision of our community. I ask you to help us achieve them through accountability and action (our "doors" are always "open"). And ultimately, as we strive for these goals, I hope that you can share our pride in what Kaleidoscope does for this island... We couldn't do it without you!


Kaleidoscope by the Numbers

For the 2024-2025 school year, Kaleidoscope:

- Was open for 248 days, more than 2,300 working hours which provided nearly **200,000 hours** of high-quality preschool and childcare services
- Supported over 120 children from 90 families who work for over 100 businesses
- Set a new personal record for maximum single-day attendance at 103 kids this summer
- Facilitated over 1,000 bags of food from the Orcas Island Food Bank finding their way into island homes (Each week, Kaleidoscope staff pick up the bags from the food bank and arrange them at the center so families can pick them up when they pick up their children on Thursdays)
- Was 1 of 15 programs chosen from across Washington state to participate in the COMETS study (read more -)
- Received funding for **6,324 hours** of preschool from the Early Childhood Education Initiative (ECEI), a local organization whose mission is to provide all of Orcas Island's youngest learners permanent access to high-quality education
- Served 10,932 wholesome breakfasts, 11,866 nutritious lunches, and 11,370 delicious snacks for a total of 34,168 meals shared across programs
- Provided **10 weeks of <u>Big Kids</u>** programming this Summer (read more \longrightarrow)
- Returned approximately 2,400 golf balls to Orcas Island Golf Course, resulting in a total of \$240 in ice cream credit
- Employed over **30 people**, 5 of which we were able to help secure housing for
- Received over 100 musical lessons from Music Charly, thanks to the Orcas Island Chamber Music Festival Preschool Music Program
- Sold about 1,000 Orcasopoly games (head to Island Market, Ray's, or Darvill's or scan the QR code to the right if you haven't gotten yours yet)



Received a **level 5 rating** (the highest possible) from <u>Early Achievers</u> (read more \longrightarrow)



- Moved to being open 5 days a week in June
- Received full funding for our Bringing Books Home program through the Orcas Island Community Foundation (OICF) Give Orcas Holiday Campaign, which will put more than 1,000 new books in homes across the island





COMETS Study

Kaleidoscope had the privilege of participating in Childhood Obesity: The role of the gut Microbiome, Outdoor Time, and Stress (COMETS), an ongoing research study through Washington State University evaluating the impact of outdoor preschool on children's gut health, stress, well-being and resilience. The kiddos of families that elected to participate wore "superhero belts" for 2 separate weeks to record physical activity, families collected saliva and stool samples, and scientists came to collect the specimens. Only 15 schools across the state were chosen to participate and Kaleidoscope was among them. We are excited to see the scientific proof of what we already know - forest school is cool!

The Return of Big Kids!

This summer, Kaleidoscope gathered school-aged groups for 10 weeks to explore the forest, collaborate with friends, learn about nature, and chill in the hammock. Many of them were Kaleidoscope alumni so it was awesome to reconnect with those families and get to know these new, larger versions of the kiddos we already love! We also made some new friends along the way and look forward to doing it again next summer.

Early Achievers Level 5 Quality Rating

Our center successfully participated in Washington's Quality Recognition & Improvement System (QRIS), otherwise known as Early Achievers. Scores are calculated in 5 areas: Learning Environment, Child Outcomes, Interactions & Curriculum, Family Engagement & Partnerships, and Professional Development & Training. An early learning program's quality level is determined by points earned throughout the three-year Quality Recognition Cycle (QRC). We were awarded a Level 5 rating - the highest achievable!

Other Fun Facts and Updates

Cultivate Learning identified Kaleidoscope as an outstanding early childhood education program and spent 3 days in our classrooms taking photos and videos to use in educational materials for early childhood educators.

Amber Paulsen, our director, testified at the Senate hearing in support of House Bill 1351, which would adjust the age requirements for accessing Early Childhood Education and Assistance Program (ECEAP), and it passed unanimously.

Our composting toilet systems are up and running in all 3 of our Forest "classrooms." Like all things preschool, we love talking about anything poop-related and we are excited to have one more reason to talk about POOP!

Did you know that more than half of our teachers and 25% of our families speak Spanish? We have a Spanish-speaking teacher in every group and prioritize bilingual opportunities daily, including in the books we send home with our Bringing Books Home program.

Kaleidoscope helped connect families to local resources, such as Orcas Community Resource Center (OCRC), OPAL, San Juan County Early Childhood Education and Assistance Program (ECEAP), Orcas Lions Club, American Legion, Early Childhood Education Initiative (ECEI), Orcas Island Community Foundation (OICF). We value our Community Connections!
